Dee Sailing Club has 2 Dart 16 catamarans available for all junior & adult members to use for a small fee, for all club racing, special events & Coaching sessions.

The Dart 16 is a 16-foot catamaran designed to be sailed by two crew with a mainsail & jib. It is a modern beach catamaran that is fast and fun. Its skeg design and thermo-plastic

construction differentiate it from other typical catamarans and make it very impact and scratch resistant. Perfect for the beach.

The Dart 16 is designed so everyone can sail it and there are several configurations to get the most out of the boat. You can single-hand the boat with the mainsail and jib. If it is too windy the jib furls for safe stowage.
